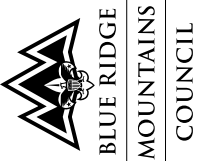

Agreement Pledge for Permit 2010-2011

Agreement between Individual Sportsman and Blue
Ridge Mountains Council, BSA

The following agreements and regulations are designed to protect the Scouts and leaders using the Blue Ridge Scout Reservation, sportsman and the landowner, and at the same time maximize the opportunity to utilize and enjoy the game available.

The sportsman agrees to respect the property and privacy of the landowner, and to observe Virginia game and fish laws.

The sportsman agrees to abide by all rules and regulations established by the Blue Ridge Mountains Council, BSA (to include but not be limited to the list attached). Any infraction of the rules by the sportsman will result in the revocation of all privileges. Such revocation will be at the discretion of the BSA agent. The sportsman understands that he is responsible for any property damage and/or any injury to himself or others while utilizing any privileges or facility on the property of the BSA.

I agree to abide by your regulations and shall indemnify, hold free and harmless, assume liability for, and defend the Boy Scouts of America, its chartered affiliates, agents, servants, employees, officers, and directors from any and all costs and expenses including but not limited to attorneys' fees, reasonable investigative and discovery costs, court costs, and all other sums which the Boy Scouts of America, its chartered affiliates, agents, servants, employees, officers and directors may pay or become obligated to pay on account of any, all, and every demand for, claim or assertion of liability, or any claim or action founded thereon, arising or alleged to have arisen out of my use of the Blue Ridge Scout Reservation belonging to the Blue Ridge Mountains Council, Boy Scouts of America, its chartered affiliates, agents, servants, employees, officers, and directors, or by any action or omission

Quality Deer Management Participation: Participation in the Reservation QDM program requires me to collect biological deer harvest data at the Powhatan check station (weight of the deer, certain specified harvest data such as location of the kill, and an extracted deer jawbone).

Key Dates:

Hunter work days will include Quality Deer Management (QDM) training and barbeque supper: September 3rd, 4th, and 24th, 2010.

BRSR Hunting and Fishing Program 2010

The Blue Ridge Scout Reservation is proud of its natural assets including fish and wildlife. The Conservation Committee is composed of professionals that provide excellent guidance. The Boy Scouts are working in partnership with the Virginia Department of Game and Inland Fisheries, BRSR Hunters Association, and the BSA Fishing Task Force to improve wildlife habitat.

The reservation has an active Quality Deer Management Program. Hunters work days continue to improve wildlife habitat including food plots. The trout fishing provides for stocking of both Max Creek and Lake Powhatan.

New for 2010:

- The permit system has been streamlined and includes both parking and key access.
- BRSR Permit will require VA Hunting/Fishing license number on file.
- Hunter work days will include Quality Deer Management (QDM) training and barbeque supper. September 3rd, 4th, and 24th, 2010.
- Special Youth Hunting Day (designated areas) will be Saturday, September 25, 2010.
- Annual and Daily fishing permits will include Max Creek (catch and release) and Powhatan Lake (daily limit 3 fish).
- BSA Certified Angling Instructor course will be conducted November 5-7, 2010

Blue Ridge Scout Reservation Hunting Rules 2010



Reservation Permits and Licenses:

All hunters on the Reservation must All Virginia hunting and fishing laws must be strictly observed. Failure to do so will result in loss of hunting privileges on the Reservation. The Blue Ridge Mountains Boy Scout Council reserves the right to close hunting on any portion of the Reservation at any time.

Hunting on the Reservation is by permit only. Hunters must:

1. Carry the BRSR permit on their person at all times while hunting.
2. Possess a valid Virginia hunting license in addition to a Reservation hunting permit.
3. Display the parking permit issued prominently on the dashboard of hunter's parked vehicle while that individual is engaged in hunting.

Camping on the Blue Ridge Scout Reservation:

Camping is allowed. Hunters who plan to camp must notify Reservation rangers of arrival and departure times, campsite location, and the names and addresses of all overnight campers.

4. No fires are permitted
5. No camping or hunting is allowed within 500 yards of any permanent building or structure on the Reservation except by special permit.

In Compliance with VADGIF:

Hunting is allowed on all legal hunting days in November.

6. With the exception of the month of November, hunting with firearms is prohibited on Friday (after 12 noon) through Saturday, Holidays, and when scout groups are present and using the reservation.
7. Bow hunting is allowed Monday through Thursday on any legal hunting day of the season. Bow hunters may hunt Fridays and Saturdays during the archery season by calling the Reservation superintendent at (540) 230-0449 and providing information about the area and time they wish to hunt and a call-back number where they can be reached.
8. Hunters under the age of 18 must be accompanied and supervised by an adult (21 or older) who currently possesses a valid Virginia hunting license.

Blue Ridge Scout Reservation specific policies:

9. Possession of alcohol or drugs on the Reservation is strictly prohibited.
10. Portable tree stands are allowed. Hunters must wear and use property safety equipment (see handout) while climbing and occupying any elevated hunting perch (tree stand). Screw-in step are permitted. Hunting stands and screw-in steps must be removed at the end of the hunting season.
11. No loaded firearms may be possessed or transported in or on any vehicle at any time on Reservation property. Modern firearms are considered to be unloaded when both the chamber and magazine are empty. Muzzleloaders are considered to be unloaded when the percussion cap has been removed from the nipple. Firearms must be unloaded while walking through "No Hunting" areas.
12. Any dogs used in hunting on the Reservation must be retrieved at the end of each hunt.
13. No off-road vehicles or ATVs are permitted.
14. Antler restrictions apply to all antlered deer harvested on the Reservation. Bucks eligible for harvest must have an outside antler spread of at least 15 inches. Hunters can estimate a buck's antler spread by viewing where the antlers are in relation to an animal's forward pointed ears. Ear tip to tip distance is approximately 15-16 inches. Therefore, if a buck's antlers are wider than his ears, the outside spread should be at least 15 inches. Hunters who violate the antler restriction will be subject to a \$100 penalty and loss of hunting privileges for the next deer season.

Any violation of stated rules or regulations may result in eviction from the area and elimination of your participation in any future hunting programs sponsored by the Blue Ridge Mountains Council.
